**Re: Change in Schedules for 8:30 AM and 1:15 PM Dockets  
Effective November 1, 2012**

With the advent of eCourt the Court is making some slight changes in the docket because the preparation time to have documents recently filed up and ready for Court will increase with the Odyssey program. To insure that the required documents are in the system and ready for the judge to use in Court the following changes will be made to our docket **effective November 1, 2012**.

Family Abuse Prevention Petitions and Stalking Petitions will be heard at 9:00 AM every day of the week. (The current time for these is 8:30 AM on Monday – Thursday and 9:00 AM on Fridays.)

Traffic First Appearances will continue to be scheduled for check-in at Room 107 at 8:15 AM but will actually be called in the courtroom at 9:00 AM daily if the party must see or wants to see a judge.

FED (evictions) cases will be moved to 1:15 PM daily. (They are currently at 8:30 AM)

Juvenile Delinquency Detention Hearings and Juvenile Dependency Shelter Hearings will be called in the courtroom at 1:30 PM (moved from the current 1:15 PM).

Note: while parties applying for court appointed attorneys may begin filling out the paper work for that prior to their 1:30 PM appearance in detention or shelter hearings they should not be scheduled to confer with the Indigent Defense Verifier until after they appear in court at 1:30 PM.

All deadlines for filing petitions, complaints and other documents for these hearings remain unchanged. Dependency and Delinquency petitions for Shelter/Detention hearings must be filed no later than 11:30 AM. If not they will not be heard until the next judicial day.

Documents for FAPA and Stalking must be filed with the Court no later than 8:15 AM or they will not be heard that day.
