Oregon eCourt in Linn County

Revised November 13, 2012

When It Will Happen (all dates subject to change):

November 30, 2012:

Revised SLR 24 takes effect. No more motion/order on one page.

December 10, 2012:

Oregon eCourt Odyssey activated in Linn County ("Go Live" date)
Emailed notices of court events starts in Linn County for all attorneys and agencies – no more paper notices.

On or before January 30, 2013:

eFiling for pilot law firms activated in Linn County.

Around February 19, 2013:

eFiling for all lawyers and agencies activated in Linn County. (Does not apply to accusatory criminal instruments)

Dates Yet To Be Determined (likely later in 2013):

Electronic signature for judges activated in Linn County
eFiling becomes mandatory in Linn County for attorneys
eFiling for District Attorney and Juvenile Department begins

How Do I Learn More and Keep Informed ?

Information and Training – external users will be able to access information about how to use eCourt through links on the Linn County Circuit Court website. Website Home Page: <http://courts.oregon.gov/linn/Pages/index.aspx>

There will be no Tyler or OETO sponsored training for external users. However the Linn County Circuit Court staff will provide limited assistance to all members of the public on how to use the system. Tyler will provide access to on line tutorials which will explain Odyssey systems that the public will use.

Glossary of common Oregon eCourt Terms:

BFSD – Budget and Finance Services Division: OJD office for budget and finance.

Early Adopter Court – the three courts that are activating eCourt and Odyssey immediately after the pilot court; Linn and Crook Jefferson go live on December 10, 2012; Jackson goes live in January 2013

eFiling – ability to file documents with court through an internet application.

ePayment – ability to pay fines and fees through an internet application

electronic signature or eSign – the ability to “sign” a document digitally on a computer without using any paper.

ETSD – Enterprise Technology Services Division – the OJD Information Technology Division – handles the technical side of eCourt

External User – any user of eCourt systems outside of the Oregon Judicial Department

FIAS – Financial Information Accounting System: current system for managing OJD accounting; will be replaced by Odyssey.

FOP – Federation of Planets – located on 23rd century Earth - Invented by Gene Rodenberry

Go Live – terminology used by Tyler for when eCourt is turned on in a court

Odyssey – a comprehensive integrated system which includes case management, document management and other elements of digital court operations; replaced OJIN and FIAS and replaces paper and file folders.

OETO – Office of Education, Training and Outreach: OJD division responsible for managing change and training staff and judges.

OJD – Oregon Judicial Department

OJIN – Oregon Judicial Information Network: current system for case management in Oregon Courts; to be replaced by Odyssey.

OnBase – a case management and document management system used by the appellate courts in Oregon rather than Odyssey.

Paper on Demand – a system that relies primarily on digital record storage but allows printing content on demand.

Pilot Court – Yamhill County Circuit Court; the first court to adopt Odyssey, used as a test site.

Portal – the virtual door that allows entry into a closed system via the internet

Tyler Technologies – the company which provides Odyssey to us. Tyler Technologies is the largest vendor of court technology in the United States.
