ORS 1.020(6) (as amended by 2014 House Bill 4066, 2014 Oregon Law Chapter 76), authorizes the Chief Justice to establish reasonable fees for use of the Oregon Judicial Case Information Network (OJCIN). Before adopting or increasing fees authorized by this statute, the Chief Justice is required to provide notice to interested persons, and for permanent fees, also provide an opportunity for comment on the proposed fees.

For purposes of this requirement:


"Comment" means a written or electronic communication delivered to the Oregon Judicial Department. If in writing, the comment shall be sent addressed to "OJCIN Fee Comment, c/o Business & Fiscal Services Division, Oregon Judicial Department, 1163 State Street, Salem, OR, 97302." If by email, the comment shall be sent to [OJCIN@ojd.state.or.us](mailto:OJCIN@ojd.state.or.us), and have "OJCIN Fee Comment" in the subject line. Comments on a proposed fee action must be received by the Oregon Judicial Department no later than 60 days after notice has been given by the Oregon Judicial Department.

"Interested Persons" means a paid subscriber to the OJCIN, the Oregon State Bar, the Oregon Trial Lawyers Association, the Oregon Association of Defense Counsel, the Oregon Collectors Association, the Oregon Land Title Association, and other persons or organizations who have requested to be notified. Such requests shall be made by the same process as submitting comments to a fee proposal.

Notice shall be provided by posting information about the fee proposal as a media release on the Oregon Judicial Department website, and by sending information about the proposed fee change via regular mail or by email to the "Interested Persons" defined in this Order.

This order takes effect immediately.
