In order to ensure the accurate and efficient transfer of data from the Oregon Judicial Information Network (OJIN) into the Oregon eCourt Case Information (OECI) system, it is necessary to cease operation of the OECI system at certain times. Because of the volume of data needing to be transferred for the go-live of the Odyssey case management system in the Multnomah County Circuit Court, a week-day shutdown and certain after-hours shutdowns of the OECI system are required. Because the listed courts use the OECI system for all court operations, not having the OECI system functioning necessitates changes in regular court operations.


For the purpose of activating the extension of time limitations available under ORCP 10A and ORS 174.120, I ORDER the following, pursuant to my authority under ORS 1.002 and 1.060(3):

May 9, 2014, shall be a mandatory closure day for the circuit courts in the following counties: Benton, Clatsop, Columbia, Crook, Jackson, Jefferson, Linn, Polk, Tillamook, and Yamhill.

This closure date is applicable to activities, judges, and personnel of the Oregon Judicial Department as follows:

1. This order does not apply to circuit courts not listed above, the Supreme Court, the Court of Appeals, Tax Court, or the Office of the State Court Administrator.
2. All SLR 1.151 and Presiding Judge Orders that implement specific hours of operation on these dates in conflict with this order are superseded for those dates during the duration of this order. The portions of those rules and orders that do not conflict with this order remain in effect.
3. Applicable OJD Personnel Rules apply to addressing alternate work assignments, work hours, and schedules for staff during this closure.
4. This order does not limit the regular work hours, work days, or judicial activities of state court judges in state court facilities on May 9, 2014, except that closure of circuit court operations in the listed counties cancels the holding of court proceedings to which the public would have the right to attend, in which a public recording is required, or which would require the presence of court staff.
5. Each presiding judge or administrative authority must provide appropriate notice of this closure to the constituency of that court.
6. This order takes effect immediately.
