



JCIP MODEL DEPENDENCY FORMS JFCPD DELINQUENCY FORMS SUMMARY OF CHANGES EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 1, 2018

Revised and new forms for juvenile dependency and delinquency cases have been posted on the JCIP website and integrated into Odyssey for immediate court use.

(1) Shelter Order (ORS 419B.185). The Shelter Order has been revised to make the reasonable and active efforts findings located in paragraph four easier to navigate and understand. This form is available in Odyssey.

(2) Notice to Parents (ORS 419B.117). This notice is required to be provided to parents or guardians at their first appearance pursuant to ORS 419B.117. Previously, the form had combined information required to be provided to parents in delinquency cases, which is now included in a separate form. The form has also been revised to include advice of rights information. A Spanish version of the form will be posted on our website soon.

(3) Restraining Order (ORS 419B.845). The restraining order is for use in cases in which the petition alleges the child has been physically and sexually abused, and the court makes the necessary findings in ORS 419B.845 allowing entry of an order restraining the alleged perpetrator from having contact or attempting to have contact with the child.

Delinquency forms

(1) Notice to Parents (419C.020). The court is required to provide a standard notice that complies with ORS 419C.020 at the first appearance of the parents or guardian. The Oregon Youth Authority is required to prepare the standard notice, and has reviewed and approved this version. A Spanish version of the form will be posted on our website soon.

(2) Fitness to Proceed Orders (ORS 419C.390 & 419C.396). The orders that require a youth to participate in restorative services have been revised to reflect the name and e-mail address of the new Juvenile Fitness to Proceed Coordinator at the Oregon Health Authority, Jessica Stout. When the court orders restorative services, a copy of the order should be sent or e-mailed to Ms. Stout.

(3) OYA Commitment Order (ORS 419C.478(4)). The court is required to use a “uniform commitment blank” when committing a youth to the Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) if such a form is approved by the Director of OYA. OYA has transmitted a form that has been approved by the director. OYA built in flexibility to use the form as an order or a judgment to allow for differences in local practices. It was provided to the court as a fill in the blank, password protected form.
