

UNION COUNTY COURTHOUSE





- Jurors will serve no more than 10 days unless required to finish a trial; average service is 1-2 trials
- Juror Pay (May be affected by pay options chosen in your online response)
 - \$10/day for first two days
 - \$25/day for each day thereafter
 - \$.20/mi for travel from your home





- Required to call or check website each week
 - 541.963.9400
 - www.courts.oregon.gov/courts/union/jury and click on Jury Schedule (see next slide for example image)
 - Each check in will provide you with the specific date for the next check-in
- Juror Messages Please listen carefully to the recorded message (or online message) for specific instructions. If your Juror # is called to report for a trial, follow the instructions in the recorded message to press 9 and speak your Juror # into the recording
- Pre-excused absences If you have any dates that you will be unavailable for jury service (such as medical appointments, pre-paid vacation, etc) please notify the jury coordinator of these dates to request a pre-excused absence. Please provide dates with as much notice as possible to be considered for approval.
- Text/Email Reminders These reminders do not take the place of weekly check-ins. You must still check the recorded jury line or website each week as instructed. If you are likely to be called for a trial these will serve as an additional reminder for those that provided cell phone and email information in your juror record on the jury website.
- If you have any physical disabilities or special needs (diet or otherwise) please notify the jury coordinator

Dress Code (SLR 3.011)

Proper attire and appropriate behavior is required by everyone entering the Union County Circuit Court and will be strictly enforced. This includes defendants, witnesses, jurors, attorneys as well as all court personnel. Anyone arriving in the courtroom dressed improperly may be sent away until properly attired.

Please remember, this is a formal occasion and your choice of clothing reflects an attitude when appearing before the court.

Attorneys, it is your responsibility to see that your clients are aware of the dress code for the courtroom.

The following apparel items are unacceptable for anyone entering the courtroom:

- 1. Tube tops, tank tops, halter tops, bare midriff tops, low cut blouses, see through tops, spaghetti straps, halter tops, or anything that is backless.
- 2. Sheer or lacy tops are allowed as long as appropriate garment or camisole is worn to cover undergarments.
- 3. Dresses or skirts shorter than the fingertips of extended arms. Must be modestly covered while bending, reaching or sitting.
- 4. Shorts (on men or women). No pajama pants.
- 5. Skirts or pants with waists that allow undergarments to be seen. No sagging, bagging or dragging pants.
- 6. Clothing that is dirty or that has large holes; cut-off sleeves or pants.
- 7. Hats or bandanas/do-rags.
- 8. Clothing that display controlled substances (tobacco, alcohol, drugs), double meanings,
- hate motivated behavior, illegal activities, obscene gestures or language, profanity, sexual references, or violence.
- 9. Slippers, bare feet, rubber shoes or flip flops (dress sandals are allowed).
- 10. Chains that could be used as weapons.
- 11. Garments meant to be worn as undergarments, worn as outer garments.
- 12. Leggings when worn alone (allowed if worn as tights).



Parking

- The parking lot will be your best option but does fill up quickly on trial days
- Side streets require a parking permit.
- Your postcard summons is your parking permit (if you have lost yours, we have extra)
- Parking permits are valid in areas designated as "Two Hour Parking Permit Allowed"
- Places to avoid:
 - Areas designated for law enforcement parking
 - Areas designated for "Residential Permit Only"
 - "Church Only" Parking between the courthouse and the church
