**Overarching Questions:** What needs to occur between notice of mental illness and the civil commitment hearing (five days)? What is the role of the mental health examiner and what is the purpose of the examination report?

#### **Pre-hearing requirements**

- Does the content required by statute for the citation include everything the PAMI should know before their civil commitment hearing?
- Who should statutorily have the legal authority to serve a citation for a civil commitment hearing?
- Is the process and 24-hour time period for defense attorney review of the PAMI's medical record sufficient?
- Are the statutory standards for the judge's determination of a warrant of detention appropriate?

- Are the processes and statute sufficient in providing the examiner medical records?
- Is statutory change necessary to address the mental health examiner shortages?
- Is 24 hours before the hearing sufficient time for the examiner to review the records established by the Oregon Health Authority by rule and the investigation report?
- Does the scope of the examination report adequately cover the information the court needs?
